Prof. Alexander Maritczak Professor of International Law at Clandestine Ukrainian University in Lviv, Head of the Department of International Law

Prof. Hersch Lauterpacht Judge of International Court of Justice, the author of the concept of human rights in international law and the term "crimes against humanity"

Dr. Raphael Lemkin The author of the term "genocide" in international law and Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide

Prof. Jan Karski (Kozielewski) Graduate of Diplomatic Studies, Professor of Georgetown University, Nobel Peace Prize nominee for the detection of the crime of Holocaust

Prof. Louis B. Sohn Graduate of Diplomatic Studies, co-author of the UN Charter, Professor of International Law of Harvard University and the George Washington University
